1 PETER 5:1-5

English Standard Version (ESV)

1 So I exhort the elders among you, as a fellow elder and a witness of the sufferings of Christ, as well as a partaker in the glory that is going to be revealed: **2** shepherd the flock of God that is among you, exercising oversight, not under compulsion, but willingly, as God would have you; not for shameful gain, but eagerly; **3** not domineering over those in your charge, but being examples to the flock. **4** And when the chief Shepherd appears, you will receive the unfading crown of glory. **5** Likewise, you who are younger, be subject to the elders. Clothe yourselves, all of you, with humility toward one another, for "God opposes the proud but gives grace to the humble."

CONTEXT & BACKGROUND:

- 1) The Apostle Peter writes this letter to persecuted churches all over the Mediterranean world about _____ years after Jesus was crucified, buried, raised and ascended into heaven.
- 2) This letter was written and distributed to them to encourage them, instruct them, and _____ them so they may be faithful to God in a world that was hostile to their faith and practice as Christians.
- 3) Peter turns his attention to _____ /Elders as he writes this letter. He writes both to the pastors/elders themselves but also to the believers in their congregations. He intends to either remind or set the standard for how a pastor/elder should _____ and _____.
- 4) Last Sunday we saw how corrupt human leaders have been a problem since the beginning of time. We walked through the Old Testament and New Testament and saw that a great many of the leaders of God's people were very corrupt. They often led God's people to _____ and immorality.
- 5) Last Wednesday evening Pastor Ben walked through many of the _____ and _____ leaders of the OT and NT. Yes, God has always provided faithful leaders too.

Jesus said to him, “**Feed my sheep.**”
