The great civilizations of antiquity—Mesopotamia, Egypt, Canaan, Greece, Rome, India, China, pre-Columbian America, and most traditional tribal cultures—the world was generally understood in religious/cosmological terms.

3. THE MODERN WORLD HAS AN _____ CREATION STORY.

Charles Darwin	Developed a biological framework for explaining life's diversity through _____ processes rather than <u>special creation</u> .
Thomas Huxley	Became one of Darwinism's most vigorous public defenders and recognized tensions between evolutionary struggle and traditional Christian ethics.
Herbert Spencer	Extended evolutionary concepts into theories of society and popularized " <u>survival of the fittest</u> ."
Karl Marx	Developed an explicitly materialistic understanding of history and society and admired Darwin's naturalistic account, though Marxism should not simply be equated with Darwinism.
Friedrich Nietzsche	Rejected Christian morality and sought an account of human meaning and values after the rejection of Christian theism.
Carl Sagan	Popularized a modern cosmic naturalism memorably summarized in his conviction that the cosmos is all that exists.
