THE <u>SIGNIFICANCE</u> of these APPEARANCES/EVENTS:

- 1) Jesus <u>CONFIRMS</u> His resurrection to His disciples.
- 2) Jesus <u>RECONCILES</u> with His disciples (after their <u>desertion</u>).
- 3) Jesus PREPARES His disciples for their coming ministry.
- 4) Jesus COMMISSIONS His disciples for their work in the Kingdom of God.

- The Passover festival was over and disciples had returned home to Galilee.

- 1) See the **POVERTY** of the disciples. vs 1-4
 - A) Economic poverty. vs 3
 - B) Political poverty. (not in Jerusalem/Rome)
 - C) Physical poverty. vs 4 & 6
 - D) Moral/spiritual poverty. vs 3

JOHN 15:4-5

4 Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit by itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in Me. **5** I am the vine; you are the branches. Whoever abides in Me and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, <u>for apart from Me you can do **nothing**</u>.

2) See the <u>DIVERSITY</u> AND <u>UNITY</u> of the disciples. vs 2

- A) passionate/impulsive Peter. vs 2
- B) insightful/deep/artistic John. vs 2
- C) pessimistic/doubting **Thomas**. vs 2
- D) <u>little known/unknown</u> **others**. vs 2

 - B) the power of His Words over ALL THINGS. vs 5-6
 - C) the power of His loving care. vs 9-13
 - D) the power of His grace/forgiveness. vs 1 & 14

IMPLICATIONS & APPLICATIONS:

- 1) Without Christ we can do nothing that is eternal.
- 2) God's people are incredibly diverse... all for His glory and purposes.
- **3)** God's people must learn to <u>RECOGNIZE</u>, <u>TRUST</u> and <u>OBEY</u> Him. When we do, there will be miraculous results and blessing.
- 4) It is only the power of <u>Christ</u> and His <u>Gospel</u> that can <u>change the world</u>.
